

HOXNE PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of meeting held at Hoxne Playingfield Pavilion on Thursday 6 August 2026 at 19.30 hours

Present:

Cllrs Richard Kruszewski, Marie Lagerberg, Bryn Lerwill, Chris Parkin (Chair). Also in attendance Ginny O'Hegarty, Parish Clerk/RFO, County Cllr Sally Mittuch, and one member of the public.

1. **Apologies** were received and accepted from Cllrs Paul Ellis, Angus Herron, Jason Middleton, Margaret Sillis and Pasco Warner. District Cllr Matthew Hicks had also provided apologies.

2. **Declarations of Interests** None received.

3. **Public Forum** County Cllr Mittuch had provided a written report for July which will be added to the website and includes information regarding:

- Reversal of the Climate Emergency Declaration by Suffolk County Council (SCC) will lead to less government funding to combat climate change in the county.
- Improvements have been made to SEND funding.
- Adult social care services provided by SCC were judged as 'Good' by the Care Quality Commission.
- As wildfires are expected to become more frequent, parishes are advised to update their Emergency Plans to include fire.
- Energy Efficient Grants towards air source heat pumps, ground source heat pumps and loft insulation are available.
- Cranswick's egg incubation unit in Weybread has been accepted despite concerns that plans have been compared to an historic baseline. The local MP has been asked to investigate a number of concerns regarding the planning process.
- A strategy is being worked on to make Eye safer for people as there are 11,000 vehicle movements through the town each day. Hoxne Parish Council highlighted that an HGV ban in Eye would have a negative impact on surrounding villages.

4. **The Minutes of the meeting held on 2 July 2026** were approved and signed.

5. **Matters arising from the Minutes of 2 July 2026** meeting were noted:

- a. The Infrastructure Working Group had submitted a response to the joint local plan scoping consultation on behalf of the Council.
- b. Council had submitted a response to EcoPower Suffolk Solar Statutory Consultation in support of Brome and Oakley Parish Council citing the concerns of Hoxne including deer collision issues. An update would be submitted to address water capture.
- c. Details of flood resilience support for listed property owners had been added to the website.

6. There had been **no applications to the two vacancies** on the Parish Council.

7. Planning

a. Council considered responses to planning applications received from Mid Suffolk District Council:

Council considered the applications and had no objections.

b. Council noted the following planning decisions:

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c. Council agreed to make representations to the MP, District and County Councillors regarding the implications for local communities arising from the expansion of the Cranswick meat processing factory at Eye Airfield.

d. There were no other planning matters.

8. Highways

- a. Update on **Eye Road and B1118 / Green Street projects**. The contractors had completed the line painting on Eye Road. The surface dressing on the B1118 had commenced but the new Slow signs had not been remarked. Cllr Kruszewski had followed up with Highways. Part of the resurfacing had come away at the top of Low Street but it did not meet Highways' threshold for this to be rectified.
- b. Update regarding **proposed 20mph Speed Limit**. The advertisement notices will be posted on site on 7th August and the advertisement will last for three weeks.
- c. Update regarding the request to SCC to fund the **changing of an uneven road surface sign to a warning triangle** advising of the possibility of agricultural vehicles ahead. The Community Liaison Engineer is continuing to work on this and will be requesting access to the incident report relating to the location.
- d. The results of the latest **B1118 ANPR data report** showed 90% of vehicles travelling between 30-34mph. The highest speed recorded was 55mph.
- e. Council approved the purchase of an **additional Speed Indicator Device** with an additional battery and would request a funding contribution from the LHB allocation. Council agreed to defer consideration of a third site and post until later in the financial year.
- f. Council decided a **rota system for moving the SIDs** was not required. Cllr Kruszewski will continue to move the devices and Cllr Lerwill is willing to provide cover when required.
- g. The Clerk had received confirmation that the unstable **SID post on Abbey Hill** would be replaced.

9. Flood Management

- a. Update regarding flood matters:
- A litter pick had been carried out at Chickering Beck.
 - Residents can register with www.floodalert.com to receive flood warnings however this only covers rivers. Cllr Lagerberg is investigating the details of a telemetry gauge which tracks rising water levels and would trigger a localised alert.
 - Council understands there are new proposals regarding how water will be discharged from Shreeves Farm, however, there have been no updates to the drainage plans on Mid Suffolk District Council's (MSDC) planning portal since April. Council will investigate with the Head of Planning at MSDC.
- b. Council agreed to submit a Locality Award funding application for an additional 6ft water gauge board (with post fixings) to be sited at Wittons Lane.
- c. Council agreed the existing 6ft water gauge board would be sited just before the junction with Abbey Hill and attached to the new 20mph post once installed. The new 3ft temporary water gauge board would be sited outside Bridge House as agreed with the property's owners.

10. Asset Management

Council considered the purchase of a dog waste bin for Syleham Road at Havensfield Hens Corner, with funding from Pride in Your Place if available. Cllr Lagerberg will check whether there is currently a footpath post at the proposed location. Council agreed that if Pride in Your Place funding is not available the purchase would be deferred.

11. General

Cllr Parkin volunteered to attend the next Wednesday lunch and report back on the number of attendees. Cllr Kruszewski reported that the PCSO will be available at the café on a monthly basis, dates to be confirmed.

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Council agreed to write to Mid Suffolk District Council to request the hedging at the front of Heckfield Green opposite the school be replaced with a green alternative that is lower and allows clear visibility.

12. Finance and Governance

- a. Council's financial position as at 31 July 2026 was reported as £28,302.28, including receipt of a street cleansing grant from Mid Suffolk District Council in the amount of £3,304.60.
